

1 on the day of the incident?

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Please do so.

4 A. First of all, this hand was paralyzed shut. Now
5 I could have opened it, and I can do it, and it hurts to do
6 it, and I'm better today, but it still hurts to do it.

7 Q. Besides --

8 A. This arm is like it's on fire all the time. It
9 hurts, it's painful. It's neurologic pain. And it's up
10 into the shoulder. But that day I didn't use this hand.
11 It was closed like that (indicating), and it hurt to use
12 the other hand.

13 The right leg was very cold. I don't know
14 whether it was 15 degrees different that day or not, I
15 don't know. When they measured it at the clinic, it was
16 15 degrees different. What it was in the hearing room, I
17 don't know, because it varied, but it was much colder.
18 Also, because of the paralysis from my surgery, my left
19 foot drops and I walk with a gait.

20 Q. You can --

21 A. And I walk with a gait, and I'm not steady on my
22 feet to this day, and I certainly wasn't then (indicating).

23 Q. Any other limitations or restrictions on
24 December 13th of 2000?

25 A. Yes, I had trigger-point shots in my neck.
