

1 Q. Are you capable of showing the jury what impact,  
2 if anything, those devices had on your ability to walk or  
3 move?

4 A. Yes. First of all, I can't get my arms out,  
5 other than just lower movement here (indicating). This  
6 shoulder strap's got everything pulled back, and that was  
7 the idea, because I had the twenty trigger-point shots in  
8 my neck and shoulders that morning. This keeps me high. I  
9 can't -- I got to -- You know, it's a little hard that way.  
10 And then there is no movement here at all (indicating). I  
11 have to -- if I want to look around I have to turn  
12 (indicating).

13 MR. BENNETT: Mr. Jevicky, if you could help him  
14 relieve himself of the devices.

15 Your Honor, I respectfully request for a recess,  
16 a brief one, or lunch.

17 THE COURT: This would be an appropriate time for  
18 recess for lunch. It's 1:20. I know the jurors would  
19 probably like an opportunity to at least have a break and  
20 have the opportunity for lunch. Why don't we -- We'll  
21 recess until -- Let's just make it an hour, till 2:20. If  
22 you can be back sooner, that's fine. Perhaps we can get  
23 started, if not right at 2:20, no later than 2:20.
