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2 Q. Is the chair rail that you are referring to  
3 depicted in Defendant's Exhibit H?

4 A. Yes, it is.

5 Q. Okay. You can just sit that in front of you.  
6 Please continue with what happened, if anything.

7 A. So I held onto the chairs to get out of the  
8 hearing room. When I got out in the hallway, I grabbed  
9 ahold of that chair rail and held onto it. I walked, I  
10 guess, south -- I guess that's west, down the hallway,  
11 around the corner into the restroom, holding onto the chair  
12 rail all the way. There's a water fountain there; I held  
13 onto it as I went around it, and went into restroom.

14 And then I came back out of the restroom, and I  
15 held onto the chair rail as I came out of the restroom,  
16 steadying myself, because I had been walking with help or  
17 with a walker. And I came around the corner in the hallway  
18 there, and Earl Carlton, one of the old commissioners that  
19 I have tremendous respect for, was going the other way down  
20 the hall towards the restroom.

21 Q. Let me --

22 A. And I -- I need to get up --

23 Q. Let me stop you right there. I don't want you  
24 to -- I don't want you to get up.

25 Basically you're coming out of -- You're coming
