| 9  | Q. What impact has that case had on your personal          |
| 10 | life, if any?  |
| 11 | A. It had a tremendously adverse impact. I've been         |
| 12 | written up in all the local newspapers. I've been the      |
| 13 | headline story three times, the main headline in the local |
| 14 | paper. <u>The Reporter</u> is here now.                    |
| 15 | But it's just not me that is hurt. It hurts my             |
| 16 | family, because I didn't do this thing that I've been      |
| 17 | prosecuted for. But more importantly it hurts my employees |
| 18 | because they depend on me to get the bonds to pay them, to |
| 19 | get the loans, and to get customers for the coal. And      |
| 20 | there has been all kinds of chatter around there about Bob |
| 21 | Murray being arrested for assault and disorderly conduct,  |
| 22 | and it's hurt us tremendously. The damage is already done. |
