

1 A. No, that's not right.

2 Q. What is the difference between bituminous and
3 anthracite?

4 A. Anthracite is a form of coal that's rarely used
5 anymore. It only occurs in the United States in central
6 Pennsylvania. There's very little mining of it.
7 Bituminous coal is the primary coal that's mined in the
8 United States. There's high-sulfur and low-sulfur
9 bituminous coal. That may be what you mean.

10 Q. Okay. I'm certainly not an expert on coal.
11 There have been recently a number of stories in
12 various news outlets about the ecological and environmental
13 effects of burning Ohio coal; is that correct?

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And that's sort of been an ongoing situation over
16 the past 10 or 15 years in terms of the increased
17 environmental awareness; is that fair to say?

18 A. Perhaps 20 years, sir.

19 Q. And, Mr. Murray, would you say that it's safe to
20 say that environmentalists, people who are engaged in
21 the -- what they would consider the protection of the
22 environment, are generally opposed to the burning of large
23 quantities of coal, specifically Ohio coal?

24 A. Are you asking that question in general?

25 Q. Yes.
