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we're ever going to mine under Dysart Woods. What Mr. Kister wanted to do was eliminate mining two miles around Dysart Woods, which would have eliminated 500 jobs needlessly with no environmental benefit at all. He just wanted to close the coal mine.

- Q. So the answer would be, yes, Mr. Kister has been involved with attempting to prevent mining under Dysart Woods, not only Dysart Woods but the surrounding areas; is that correct?
- A. A large surrounding area which would have closed the coal mine.

And the Ohio Reclamation Commission hearing of

- December 13th -- 12th and 13th was directly related to what's called a lands unsuitable petition; is that right?

 A. Yes. The federal law gives our companies an exemption from an unsuitability for mining petition, and the hearing was about preserving that exemption, which we have, and the board upheld our exemption.
- Q. So at the moment, as that decision stands, Dysart Woods are not considered lands unsuitable for mining.
- A. That's right. But for every mine in the vicinity or under Dysart Woods an entire application must be submitted to the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, and it is then when everyone will decide involved whether mining can take place under Dysart Woods or even in the
